

Filtering Results

Search results can be filtered to help you find exactly what you're looking for! You can also run an Advanced Search within individual databases or from the Gale Primary Sources database by selecting **Advanced Search** right beside the search bar. Once you've entered search terms, you can filter by:

- database
- source
- document type
- publication date
- language
- subject
- author
- person

You can also use the **Topic Finder** and **Term Frequency** features on the right hand side to pick away at what terms you should be using and what they are connected to.

To Send or Download?

When to Send the document to your cloud

Are you using a public computer? Do you plan on bouncing between devices while doing your projects?

1. Find a document that you want to save.
2. On the top right, select **Sign in with Google** or **Sign in with Microsoft** to gain access to your existing Google Drive or Microsoft OneDrive.
3. Select **Send to...** on the upper right and select Drive for Google or OneDrive for Microsoft.
4. Select the page range and **Send**.
5. Select **Ok**.

Depending on the file size, it will take a few minutes to show up in your Google Drive or Microsoft OneDrive.

When to Download the document to your device

Are you printing the document off? Are you planning to use the document without the internet?

1. Find the document that you want to save.
2. Select **Download** on the upper right.
3. Select the page range and **Download**.
